

# Claims Submitted to FTA - Combined PI & GL



### **Roller Door Damage at Client Location**

A photographer was taking photos at a client's location when the insured forgot to remove a bollard. As a result, the insured activated the roller door, causing damage to the engine, which required repairs.

**Claim Payout:** \$16,000



### Fencing Incident at University Event

The insured, an event organiser, arranged an event at a university with temporary fencing set up around the venue. The fencing fell onto the claimant, resulting in bodily injury. The claimant sued the event organiser, and FTA covered the total sum.

**Claim Payout:** \$150,000



### Slip and Fall at Home Office

The insured, a business consultant, was hosting a client at their home office when the client slipped and fell while descending the stairs, resulting in bodily injury and a subsequent lawsuit. FTA defended the insured and covered the medical expenses and related liabilities.

**Claim Payout:** \$25,000



# Damage to 2-Way Radio During Installation

The insured, an IT consultant, was installing iPads in rescue vehicles when the installation process inadvertently caused damage to the 2-way radio in one of the cars. As a result, the insured was required to pay for a new 2-way radio and its installation.

**Claim Payout: \$35,000**
